SHARING SUCCESS



Panhandle Special Needs was over the moon to receive our \$10,000 in May 2022 and didn't hesitate to put that money to good use in fulfilling our Mission of improving the lives of people with disabilities.

Our first purchase was six new computers for our staff and clients that made a huge difference in our ability to deliver life skills training and have a little fun.

Next up we purchased 15 new Greenhouse tables that significantly increase our growing space and due to their sleek and efficient style increased our floor space as well greatly improving accessibility for all during our growing season and our Annual Christmas Market.

IDAHO CONSERVATION LEAGUE

With support from 101 Women, the Idaho Conservation League harnessed the power of volunteers to assess water quality in the Pend Oreille basin in 2023. The program supports healthy drinking water and recreation opportunities for Bonner County residents and visitors.

This funding allowed 31 citizen scientists to collect water samples at 15 locations from May - September. Samples were then evaluated for pollution by a laboratory, and the results indicated that existing regulations requiring water clean-up near the shoreline should remain in place. It also provided evidence that high-quality water treatment must be installed at the Kootenai Ponderay Sewer District!



Our promotion of the work led to these dedicated volunteers being selected as Timeless Adult Volunteers by the Idaho Nonprofit Center and as the Governor Cecil D Andrus Volunteers of the Year from the Governor's Commission on Service and Volunteerism.



FINANCES AT A GLANCE

101 Women Sandpoint is in excellent financial health. We have savings of over \$10,000 which the board has invested in a high interest-bearing money market. Interest income made up 1% of our income this year.

This extra income has helped offset the increased cost of renting the Heartwood Center. We believe those additional costs are worth it. We have had the greatest attendance for our Membership Meetings at the Heartwood.

The Board plans to consider what to do with any savings we accumulate over the \$10,000 cushion we currently have in the next year.
